## 2019 ASPE Minnesota Chapter Scholarship Instructions

Dear Applicant,

The ASPE Minnesota Chapter Scholarship is funded by donations made to the Chapter for that purpose and is available to seniors in accredited secondary schools or home school programs. To apply for the Scholarship, your application and supporting materials must be received no later than Friday June 28th of the year of graduation from high school. The award is made no later than July 31. Only those applications that are completed and received by the deadline will be considered.

## **Eligibility**

To be eligible for the ASPE Minnesota Chapter Scholarship, applicants must meet the following criteria:

	Minnesota Chapter member;
	Be enrolled full time as a high school senior or in a home school program, progressing normally toward graduation, and planning to enter college no later than the fall following graduation;
	Have been accepted at an accredited technical school, college, or university as a full time student;
	Have a strong commitment to pursue an associate, bachelor's, or technical degree at an accredited institution;
	Show involvement in co-curricular and community activities;
	Demonstrate academic achievement (minimum grade point average of 2.5)

The Minnesota Chapter Scholarship Committee will review all applications and make the award to the student who's academic and extra-curricular activities show promise, a desire to succeed, and a commitment to making a positive contribution to others. The selected student will receive the ASPE Minnesota Chapter Scholarship with a maximum award of \$1000. The Scholarship check will be made out to both the student and the College or Technical School where the student has enrolled and has been accepted.

The Minnesota Chapter Scholarship Committee reserves the right to withdraw the scholarship award if the scholarship check is not cashed in the same year of scholarship application or for any other reason.
